Exhibited in solo and group art exhibitions at public and private venues in several UK towns and cities, featuring two and three dimensional pieces in diverse media; performed 'open studio' sessions and live demonstrations of techniques; designed and distributed posters, brochures, leaflets and catalogues; welcomed visitors; dealt with customers; delivered introductory speeches; prepared refreshments; hosted opening receptions; negotiated and undertook commissions for portraits, logos, card designs, silhouette art and still-life; donated artwork for charity auctions.
